Oral Comments: Speakers are asked to register in advance via the Zoom platform, meeting information listed on the agenda. You will be asked to enter a name, an email address, and the Agenda item about which you wish to speak or to state that you wish to provide a comment about an item that is not on the agenda. Your email address will not be disclosed to the public. After registering, you will receive an email with instructions on how to connect to the meeting.

When the City Clerk announces the item on which you wish to speak, including general public comments, your name will be called and you will be unmuted. Approximately 300 words total can be read in three minutes.
