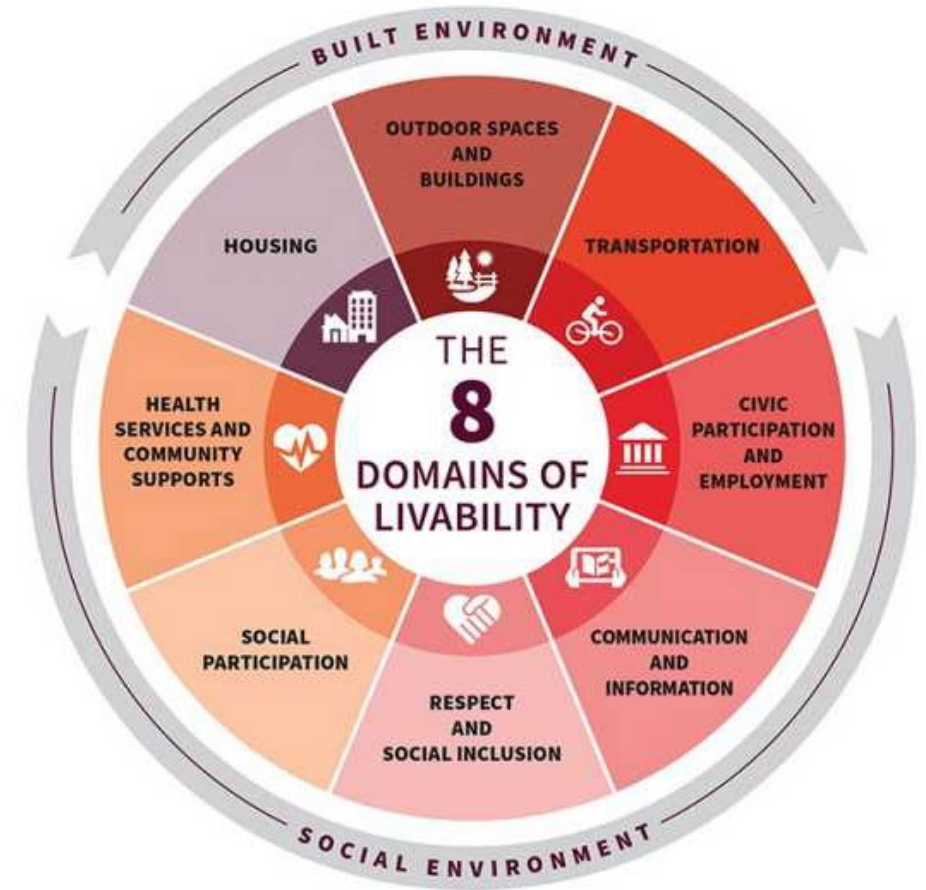

Phase 1: Attain Age-Friendly City Status

Formed Age-Friendly Task Force	September 2022
Stakeholder Focus Groups / Interviews	November 2022 - January 2023
Task Force Data Review / Prioritization	February 2023 - April 2023
SSF Age-Friendly City Application Submission and Approval	May 2023 - June 2023

Phase 2: Maintain Age-Friendly City Status

Re-Engage Age-Friendly Task Force	August 2024
AARP Survey Outreach	August 2024 – December 2024
Age Friendly Community Engagement Sessions / City Department Interviews	October 2024 – February 2025
Data Review / Draft Action Plan	March 2025 – current
