Project Description and Scope of Work:

The City of South San Francisco has developed the El Camino Real Bicycle and Pedestrian Corridor Study to take the next step in the planning and implementation of the Active South City Plan vision and the General Plan's Mobility and Safety Plans. The goal of the Corridor Study is to plan for and identify potential design concepts which incorporate Class IV bicycle facilities along the El Camino Real corridor, deploy community engagement activities to collect feedback from members of the community affected by the immediate changes and those who do not typically participate in these efforts. The Corridor Study will include substantive outreach and a temporary demonstration project on El Camino Real in partnership with Smart Growth America, Caltrans, SMCTA, SamTrans, Silicon Valley Bicycle Coalition, and San Mateo County Office of Education.

The Study will focus on El Camino Real between the Town of Colma limits to the City of San Bruno city limits, a distance of approximately 2.7 miles. A segment shall serve as an area for a Temporary Demonstration Project to establish Complete Streets and include the installation of protected bicycle lanes, hybrid bus/bike platforms, and high visibility crosswalks, which would then be used to engage the community on the corridor priorities and potential impacts.

The El Camino Real Bicycle and Pedestrian Corridor Study will ultimately consist of the following tasks and associated costs:


