Meanwhile, his wife Esther diligently takes care of all the accounting for the new restaurant at their home right around the corner.



The Snyder Family's personal encounters with child abuse and neglect, along with Esther's belief that every child deserves a chance and a future, is what led to the Foundation's passionate focus on prevention and intervention in the lives of children and youth.

HIS EYES™ was founded by Evan Ellingson, who deeply believed that we should view people experiencing homelessness through God's Eyes. Our Foundation pays tribute to Evan's vision, bringing hope to the homeless community by seeing them through God's Eyes. We believe that each person has a story worth telling and a life worth saving. Our vision is to create a world where everyone has a place to call home and a community that supports them.




- 51 dedicated parking spaces,

OPTIMAL DRIVE-THRU QUEUING


