3. 2025 Collision Statistics – 2nd Quarter (April – June)

Police Sergeant Jim Portolan presented the bicycle and pedestrian collision statistics for the second quarter of 2025 (April to June). Sergeant Portolan was joined by Robert Flagg from LAZ Parking who manages the parking team in South San Francisco. Mr. Flagg presented about LAZ Parking's operations in the city. Commissioners and Committee members participated in a discussion with Sergeant Portolan, Mr. Flagg, and City staff about the collision statistics, preventative measures, and parking management practices.

4. Active 101 Presentation and Input Opportunity (San Mateo County Transportation Authority)

Peter Skinner, Nicole Arshad, and Marissa Mathias from the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (TA) presented on the TA's Active 101 project to identify and prioritize crossing and corridor improvements across and along Highway 101. The TA is leading the process to design a Class I shared-use path along Gateway Boulevard from E. Grand Avenue to Oyster Point Boulevard in South San Francisco. This will be part of a regional bicycle and pedestrian corridor along Highway 101 throughout San Mateo County.

The Commissioners and Committee members discussed the proposed Class I shared-use path on Gateway Boulevard and probed about the possibilities of prioritizing bikeways in other locations before a bikeway on Gateway Boulevard. The Commissioners and Committee members expressed their strong interest in bikeways through the Airport Boulevard and Oyster Point Boulevard intersection.

 Committee Member Yip expressed his thanks for this evening's presentations on the collision statistics and the LAZ parking management efforts.
