What do you view as the greatest issue presently confronting the City Council of the City of South San Francisco?

Quality of life. Currently South San Francisco is facing a biotech boom at the same time as the pandemic. We need to be able to continue fostering our relationship with our Biotech companies, leverage their resources, and utilize those resources to ensure a higher quality of life for our community. We've done so with the bay trail and to schools. We need to work on responsible development that will increase our economy, fund our parks and schools, and address other issues like traffic.

What in your background will best prepare you to function as an elected official?

I am an attorney and the vice chair of the parks and recreation commission. I have run elections with the National Fil. American Lawyers Association as a Regional governor, and the Asian American Bar Assoc. My wife and I have a local business, our law practice in South City. I am able to effectively communicate, speak and make executive level decisions on policies that affect every day people. I am knowledgeable about law/policy but also passionate about civil rights and our city. I have lived in South San Francisco most of my life and love my community. I'm not just an attorney - I own my own business, I'm a father, I'm an artist/musician, a soccer dad, I own rentals (but have been a renter in the past), have been a civil rights attorney and worked for companies and businesses, and run nonprofits. I work closely with the Latino community as a soccer coach and I have dedicated my life to working on immigration, domestic violence, and family issues (divorce/child custody). At the same time, I can organize events (founded a conference) and have been published.

What role do you believe local government should fulfill in people's lives?

We should deliver services to our community and ensure that there is a strong infrastructure to ensure the function of the city and also plan for responsible development. I believe that South San Francisco's government should focus on enhancing the quality of life for its members, but at the same time, should help to ensure that we attract businesses and new residents who can bring diversity and commerce to our city. The government should protect civil rights but also be fiscally sound. I think that it's important to understand that South San Francisco is built from a diaspora of people of different creeds, backgrounds, and economic status. There is a place for everyone in South City - we as a city should support our diversity and should address the needs of our constituents, be it through housing, policing (revamping our police), our education (working with the school board), and with ensuring services (parks and recs, child care, etc.)
