Resolution No. _____ San Mateo Youth Commission, State of California ***** RESOLUTION AFFIRMING A COMMITMENT TO YOUTH NITROUS OXIDE ABUSE PREVENTION, AND DIRECTING SAN MATEO COUNTY DEPARTMENTS AND EMPLOYEES TO IMPLEMENT ACTIONS THAT PROTECT YOUTH FROM HARMFUL SUBSTANCES THAT WILL CAUSE LIFELONG HEALTH EFFECTS RESOLVED, by the San Mateo County Youth Commission of the State of California, that WHEREAS, the Youth Commission is committed to fostering a community of healthy youth; and WHEREAS, Nitrous Oxide or "whippet" causes long term health effects including brain and liver damage, kidney damage and failure, and depression and psychosis. WHEREAS, Nitrous Oxide abuse is a problem among the community and their products are being sold in San Mateo County smoke shops without age verification. Products are disguised in products like	Joint Resolution No. 25-B San Mateo County Board of Education and San Mateo County Superintendent of Schools State of California Recognizing February 2025 as Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month Whereas, in the United States, one in three teens experience physical, sexual, or emotional abuse from a romantic partner; and Whereas, nearly half of youth who have experienced intimate partner abuse experienced incidents of abuse at school; and Whereas, teen dating violence hinders students' education and well-being; and Whereas, newly witnessing such violence is associated with decreased school attendance and academic performance; and Whereas, those who experience teen dating violence are more likely to also experience depression, anxiety, and suicidal ideation; and Whereas, educating young people about healthy relationships can alter attitudes that normalize violence and prevent abuse that plagues too many relationships and harms too many lives. Mental Health Directories

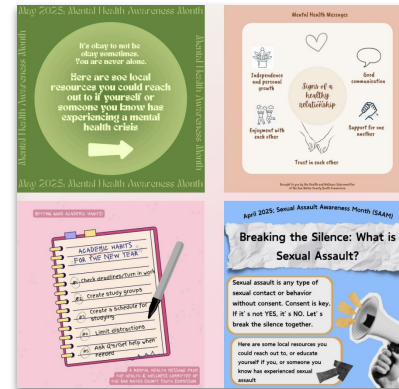
- Tips and resources about anxiety, stress, relationships, and health (mental and physical)
