Dear Mayor Nagales and Councilmembers,  
Thank you for your continued work with us regarding the School Liaison Officer MOU. I do want to point out some confusing language in the data collection section (under Section X. Program Evaluation and Assessment). See highlighted text in attached screenshot.

Per our Feb. 24 minutes\*, “the Trustees wanted to include language that the City will agree to provide relevant data for SSFUSD students within 30 days from the end of the school year.” However, the way it was incorporated into the draft MOU now says (in two spots) that data should be provided “prior to 30 days BEFORE the end of the current school year” rather than the intended “within 30 days AFTER the end of the current school year.” This error was on our end, and I request the council consider modifying the language to reflect the intent.

The District will be responsible for gathering this aggregated data. The District will collect relevant demographic and outcome data for district students prior to 30 days before the end of the current school year. The City of South San Francisco will also track and share data with the school district regarding the number of student arrests and citations, by gender, race/ethnicity, and any other relevant data, prior to 30 days before the end of the current school year.
