RECOGNITION OF OCTOBER AS NATIONAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH

September 23, 2020

- WHEREAS, domestic violence remains a pervasive issue across South San Francisco, the United States and the world with implications for personal and community health; and
- WHEREAS, domestic violence does not discriminate and touches all communities regardless of age, race, disability, gender identity, or socioeconomic status: and
- **WHEREAS**, domestic violence is not limited to physical violence and highlights behavior to gain control and power over a partner, significant other, and/or family member; and
- **WHEREAS**, domestic violence involves control, physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, intimidation, isolation, verbal abuse, male privilege, and economic abuse; and
- WHEREAS, 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men will experience physical violence by their intimate partner at some point during their lifetime; and
- **WHEREAS**, 1 in 3 women and 1 in 6 men experience some form of sexual violence in their lifetime; and
- **WHEREAS**, at least 5 million acts of domestic violence occur annually to women aged 18 years and older; and
- WHEREAS, victims of domestic violence experience emotional and psychological trauma, homelessness, develop alcohol and drug dependency; and
- **WHEREAS**, domestic violence is the leading cause of death, illness, and disability for women under 45 years of age; and
- WHEREAS, ALLICE Alliance for Community Empowerment engages individuals and groups to share resources toward educating the public about healthy relationships; and
- WHEREAS, research shows that by creating communities where people are connected, supportive and care for one another can reduce incidents of domestic violence
- **WHEREAS**, every day in South San Francisco individuals and organizations play a part in supporting people impacted by domestic violence, providing services including therapeutic, legal, educational, housing, advocacy, and medical services.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Mayor Richard Garbarino and the City Council of South San Francisco do hereby proclaim October as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
