Definition of Abuse

Intimate partner violence (IPV), dating abuse, or relationship abuse is a **pattern of behaviors** where one partner asserts power and control over the other through coercion, fear and intimidation, including the treat or use of violence.

Facts about Intimate Partner Abuse



Occurs among:

- all genders
- **every community** regardless of age, economic status, race, religion, ethnicity or nationality, sexual orientation, or educational background.
- heterosexual or same-sex couples

Facts about Intimate Partner Abuse



Lifelong consequences include:

- emotional trauma,
- lasting physical impairment,
- chronic health problems, and even death.
