It has been uplifting to see more and more of our local teens working, after years of seeing adults taking jobs that once were the starting place for students, mostly fast-food and retail, places that would rethink their budgets should this ordinance pass. We've also had an increase in those community members who have special needs, who have found employment, what will become of their lives should they no longer be needed at these higher wages?

While we cannot ignore the fact we live in one of the most expensive areas in the world, and we need to ensure those who work here are receiving proper pay for their work, putting this undue burden on the many mom and pop, small businesses, etc, does not seem sustainable for anyone.

Our entry level positions benefit our youth and special need community members, while the income is important, so are the valuable lessons, and that feeling that comes from being a productive citizen.

To date, I've received correspondence from 6 residents who share this concern, and although I have encouraged them to contact our Council directly, I realize many do not take that next step.
