

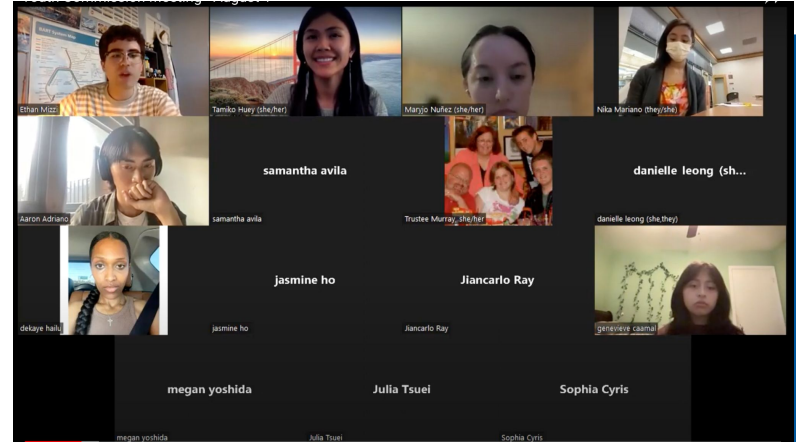

    - SSF 2020 Youth Summer Internship Program
  - Heard presentations from Peninsula Clean Energy and the South San Francisco Education Foundation

# Our Achievements



- ❑ Held a Youth Town Hall on 9/2/2022
- ❑ Worked with Staff from the Library to plan and organize the South San Francisco Youth Poet in Residence Program
- ❑ Passed a recommendation to City Council opposing the potential CalTrans sponsored expansion of US Route 101 as part of the 101 Managed Lanes Project
