What is the General Plan?

Purpose of the General Plan

- Long-term policy document to guide the future actions (policy choices + development applications) of South San Francisco
- Serves as City's "constitution"
- Preserves and enhances community strengths
- Addresses a number of topics of concern
- Enables the community to come together to develop a shared vision for the future


What is a General Plan?


A General Plan is like a road map for the future of the City of South San Francisco.






Community Advisory Committee


