WHEREAS, the City of South San Francisco first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through education, prevention, and emergency response; and

WHEREAS, the City of South San Francisco residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire; and

WHEREAS, the 2019 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape," effectively serves to remind us of the simple actions we can take to stay safer from fire not only during Fire Prevention Week but year-round.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Mayor Karyl Matsumoto and the City Council of South San Francisco do hereby declare October 6-12, 2019, as

"FIRE PREVENTION WEEK"

in South San Francisco and urge the South San Francisco community to heed the important safety messages of Fire Prevention Week and to support the many public safety activities and efforts of the South San Francisco Fire Department and Emergency Services.
