RECOGNITION OF NOVEMBER AS NATIONAL NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH November 13, 2019

WHEREAS, the history of Native American Heritage Month goes back to 1915 when Red Fox James, a Native American of the Blackfoot nation took it upon himself to ride a horse from state to state seeking approval from 24 separate state governments for a day to honor the "American Indian"; and

WHEREAS, long before European explorers set foot on the North American continent, this great land was cultivated and cherished by generations of American Indians; and

WHEREAS, California has the second largest Native American population in the United States; and

WHEREAS, it wasn't until 1990 when November was first designated as National American Indian Heritage Month and since then, we have celebrated the legacy of the first people to call this land home; and

WHEREAS, these Native people have possessed a wealth of acquired wisdom and skills in hunting, tracking, and farming – knowledge and skills that would one day prove to be invaluable to traders and settlers from Europe; and

WHEREAS, young and old alike know the story of Sacajawea, the Shoshone woman who helped to guide Lewis and Clark on their historic expedition and, in so doing helped to open the door to the Great West; and

WHEREAS, this month, we especially recognize the immeasurable contribution of American Indians and Alaska Natives who serve in the Armed Forces at five times the national average; and

WHEREAS, the American Indian heritage is a rich array of many different cultural legacies—each as unique as the tribes themselves.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Mayor Karyl Matsumoto and the City Council of the City of South San Francisco remain committed to preserving and protecting Native American cultures, languages, and history, while ensuring prosperity and opportunity for all Native Americans.
