As a long-time resident of SSF, I knew there was a city-run preschool, but was shocked at how hard it was to get a spot. When I first applied for my child, she was only one month old, and it took **three years** before a spot was available for her. Thankfully, I have a good support system and could afford to wait that long but I doubt every parent has that luxury. With such a long wait period, there is clearly a dire need for more spots in our preschool program. My experience with the preschool program thus far has been phenomenal and the long wait list indicates how rarely children withdraw from the program. I hope the council votes to increase the number of spots in our program to meet the needs of our wonderful community of parents.
